In September 2024, Hurricane Helene caused widespread flooding and devastation in Western North Carolina, with long-lasting economic and structural effects. SECU Foundation quickly responded with an initial \$3.75 million disaster relief package, followed by two additional phases of funding, \$1.75 million in November 2024 and \$3.45 million in February 2025. SECU Foundation will provide ongoing support to Western North Carolina as they rebuild and recover from Hurricane Helene.
