

Remedies:

- \$5K Bonus, Supports, PDs
- Surveys, Interventions
- Addition of 2 New Campuses

Current Status:

- Closing on the buildings completed
- 2 New principals have been hired for the new campuses
- More than 50% of the 80 new staff members have been hired so far
- 1,200 new applications have been received so far
- Improvements and renovations are underway
